The Pines is currently looking for:

Restorative Aides

Casual – minimum of ten (10) days during the six (6) week schedule period, including at least (4) days that fall on a weekend)

Reporting to the Activities Manager, the Restorative Aide implements restorative programs to assist and support residents to restore, maintain or improve activities of daily living and psychosocial/mental functioning.

The Restorative Aide’s key areas of responsibility include, but are not limited to:

- Implement and assist in evaluating both individual and group restorative programs based on assessed needs of individual residents as assigned by the Manager and Registered Staff.
- Transport residents to and from programs
- Assist with feeding residents during meal times
- Monitor the behavior and condition of residents during restorative programs, reporting any significant changes to the Manager and registered staff as appropriate
- Participate in care conferences/ other committees as required to assist in assessing restorative needs of resident
- Participate in development and revision of programs under the guidance of the Manager and registered staff
- Maintain program and resident records according to standards
- Track and log resident assistive devices used in the home
- Clean and maintain restorative equipment and conduct pre-use equipment checks
- Perform responsibilities of the position with the legislative and regulatory standards set out in applicable Provincial and Municipal legislation, and the policies and procedures of the Pines
- Participate in continuing education and in-service training required to ensure skills and abilities are maintained and enhanced
- Protect the health & safety of residents, co-workers and self by adopting safe work practices, reporting unsafe conditions immediately, and participating in health & safety related training
- Work co-operatively with staff, volunteers, service providers, other stakeholders to meet resident and family needs
- Contribute to an environment of continuous improvement by providing feedback / suggestions and engaging in implementation

The skills, experience and qualifications we are seeking for this job include:

- Graduate of a two (2) year college program in Kinesiology, Gerontology or related program
- Completion of Restorative Care Certificate (3-day course)
- Previous experience working with seniors in restorative programs, preferably in LTC, would be an asset plus on-the-job orientation and training of up to 1 month
- Completed police record check, including vulnerable sector screening
- Good communication skills and ability to read, write and follow written instructions in English
- Excellent interpersonal skills with a positive history of patience, compassion and courtesy when dealing with residents and others
- Basic computer skills

All employees of the Pines are required to complete a Police Record Check, including a vulnerable sector screening.
